
Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter of 24th September about the broadcast that you heard on 881 kc/s.

The information you supplied in your letter agrees with that which we were radiating at the time and we confirm therefore that it was our broadcast that you heard. The Beethoven and Tchaikovsky concert which you heard being trailed were indeed being broadcast on the Third programme that evening, it being not unusual in fill-up periods such as this to trail particular items in other programme services. 881 kc/s of course broadcasts the Welsh version of the Home service.

We should correct your last paragraph inasmuch as the announcer would not have announced 'The British Broadcasting Company.' The BBC became a corporation in 1927.
