DEAR MR. SAMPSON:

THIS LETTER IS TO CONFIRM A RECEPTION REPORT OF OUR SIGNAL, ON FEBRUARY 18, 1963. WE OPERATE WITH A POWER OF 1,000 WATTS FULLTIME, NON DIRECTIONAL DAYS, AND DIRECTIONAL NIGHTS. OUR RADIATING SYSTEM CONSISTS OF TWO GUYED VERTICAL TOWERS, SERIES EXCITED, AND OUR PATTERN IS A CARDIOID, WITH THE TWO TOWERS EQUALLY DRIVEN AND 96 DEGREES OUT OF PHASE. OUR TOWERS ARE 187 FEET HIGH. THIS MEANS OUR SIGNAL IS AIMED DUE EAST. THE BROADCAST YOU HEARD WAS A SPECIAL PROGRAM AS WE NORMALLY SIGN OFF AT MIDNIGHT. YOUR OBSERVATIONS OF OUR PROGRAM SEGMENTS GENERALLY COINCIDE WITH OUR LOG FOR FEBRUARY 18, 1963. WE ARE HAPPY TO RECEIVE REPORTS OF DISTANT RECEPTION FROM AMATEUR, AND DX LISTENERS.
