Dear Mr. Sampson:

Our thanks for your reception report of WBUC on ^{12/10}~~August 4~~, 1962.
It was correct, and it is with pleasure that we verify your reception of this station.

WBUC is three years old today. We began December 13, 1959 with 1,000 watts and this year on August 4, increased power to 5,000 watts. The new transmitter is the latest model Gates, model BC-5-P2. It uses a single triode for the final amplifier, a type 3X2500F3 with 5,300 volts on the plate and a plate current of 1.25 amperes. The modulator deck is Class B with a pair of the same tube type.

The transmitting antenna is a 200 foot tower located in a small valley on flat ground. It is 380 feet from the transmitter and is fed with underground co-ax.

Our studios, control room and transmitter are located in the same building. We normally use three turntables, four tape players and three microphones for program sources. In addition we have a second control room well equipped for commercial recording, program production, or on the air work if the main control room fails. It is an easy to operate installation.
