were on Night Pattern at the time.


We operate on a directional pattern, night and day,
a 3-in-line Tower arrangement for day; a 4-tower parallelogram 1 KW
power at night.

You can see there is a notch in the nighttime pattern
for New Jersey locations.

Our Transmitter is a 5 KW, R.C.A., B.T.A. 5 R with
power cutback for night power. Our Transmitter is located 3 miles south
of Altoona, near U.S. Route 220.
