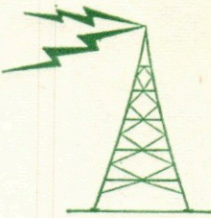

Dear John:


This letter is in effect, an answer to your "DX" report as found referenced above. We are glad to verify your report as reported, as we were on the air conducting tests on Monday morning October 21, 1963.

Just a little about our station: We are a 1,000 Watt-er (daytime only) located on 1600 KCS. Our transmitter is a type BTA-1R by R. C. A. Our frequency checks are suppose to be conducted on the third (3rd) monday morning of each month from 0045 until 01:00 or thereabouts. Oh yes, we are located just outside the city limits of Nashville, Georgia which is a small south georgia community of around 4700 persons. Nashville is located about 50-60 miles north of the Florida State line and the main highway which runs through our town is # 129.

I might mention too that since our October 21st tests we have received "DX" reports from Michigan, New York, ~~Michigan~~, Illinois, Brookland and two reports from New Jersey.

Many thanks for your report and we hope that we have been some help to you.
