Dear Mr. Sampson;


This is to confirm receipt of your letter noting reception in your area on July 1, 1962 at 6:00 A.M. We sign on each morning at 6AM and sign off at sunset each evening.

We have been undergoing technical changes here at WOTW, and hope in the near future to install a new AM transmitter which will clear up any troubles that might exist in the old equipment. Two weeks ago, we started programming in our new studios, which include an Altec console, Ampex 300 tape equipment, H.H.Scott preamps for turntables (Rekocuts), ATC cartridge tape equipment, and several other custom pieces of equipment. We have filed for 20KW on FM at 102.1, which we are in hopes of receiving a construction permit in the near future. Our AM transmitter is of 1947 vintage...an old Raytheon which has seen better days. Apparently, it was not working up to full power before I started here as Chief Engineer, but at the moment, we are up to a good strong 1KW of power with the proper amount of modulation. With a new Transmitter, new limiters, and a good AGC unit, we should increase our signal strength even further.

Our ground system consists of copper strapping, good and wide, laid two feet deep (250 feet, criss-crossed and bonded to wire mesh)..our antenna is a base-loaded 250 ft self-supporting truscon antenna, located on interstate 93 just south of Nashua, N. H. Our pattern is non-directional.
