From 6:48 AM to 7:03 AM, ^{Daylight} Eastern Standard Time on Sun. June 24, 1962

I was quite pleased to hear station WWCO broadcasting on a frequency of 1240 kcs. Programming

7:00 Announcement that the "Sunday Morning Sound of Music" is in
~~program~~ progress - then more ~~music~~ news
7:02 Announcement about seat belts, presented by the National Safety
Council
7:03 More news

I used a Hammarlund HQ-129-X receiver with 4 1/2 foot (diagonal) loop antenna. Interference was quite heavy from several stations - but WWCO was quite strong
Weather conditions were clear & 65° ^{here?} I would greatly appreciate a verification of reception from WWCO (on your letterhead stationery, if possible). I am enclosing return postage for your convenience in replying. I would also appreciate information concerning your antenna system and pattern.
