Dear Mr. Sampson:

Thank you for tuning in to 1220 CJRL on September 12, 1998. We transmit from Kenora, Ontario, which is on the north shore of Lake of the Woods, 72 miles east of Canada's geographic centre, and 138 miles north of the Canada/U.S. border. Our regional broadcast market is just over 50,000 people.

Your letter was forwarded to me by John Sinclair, who engineers the workings of the nine stations in the Fawcett Broadcasting family; Our station in Kenora, another in Dryden, Ontario (CKDR am800), and another in Fort Frances, Ontario (CFOB am640), with CKDR repeater stations in Red Lake (am1340), Ear Falls (am1450), Sioux Lookout (am1400), Hudson (am1450), Ignace (am1340), and Atikokan (am1240).

Our broadcast signal is 5000 watts daytime, and 1000 at night. We employ a staff of 20 people in an adult contemporary/pop-rock format, in an area economically supported mainly by the forest and tourism industries.
