Thank-you for your reception report from June 13, 2000 at 11:30 am CST. Your report was indeed accurate so please accept this letter as confirmation or your reception of CJVR on June 13, 2000.

Our transmitter site is located approximately 30 kms south of Melfort near Pleasantdale, Sask. We transmit in AM Stereo at a power of 25,000 watts day and night with a Nautel Ampfet 25. Our stand-by transmitter is a Nautel Ampfet 10. The studios are located in Melfort and use the Scott Studios computer system for on-air while the newsroom utilizes the Broadcast News I-NES computer system for text/audio editing and on-air presentation.

Please check into our web site at www.cjvr.com. Real Audio is only available during our sports play by play broadcasts.

It is somewhat unusual for our signal to travel that distance during the daytime as our main lobe of radiation is toward the north on a sloppy omni pattern. While on vacation last year, my family and I stayed overnight in Grand Rapids, MN on our way back from Madison, Wisconsin. I was not able to listen to CJVR until we were in Rugby, ND. So thank-you for your report.
