Thank-you for your reception report of November 18, 2008. Your report was indeed accurate so please accept this letter as confirmation of your reception of CK750 (CKJH on 750 kHz) on November 18, 2008 at 10:01 pm CST.

CJVR signed on for the first time on October 8, 1966 on 1420 kHz. In July of 1995, the move was made to 750 kHz. On March 1, 2002, CJVR moved to the FM band (CJVR-FM) keeping it's country format while Oldies CK750 (CKJH-AM) launched on 750 kHz. CJVR-FM is on 105.1 (100 kW ERP) with a rebroadcaster at Dafoe (120 km south of Melfort – 100 kW on 100.3) and a second rebroadcaster in the Prince Albert National Park on 106.3 (11 kW), 150 km northwest of Melfort and CJVR-FM-3 (45 W) in Carrot River, approximately 100 km northeast of Melfort.

I apologize for the tardy reply as, unfortunately, housekeeping items were move to the back burner with the launch of CHWK-FM.
