## Radio Station KAKK:

- 1:56 Song (in progress when I tuned in)
- 2:00 Station ID ("KQ 102 is KQKK, 101.9 FM, Walker, Pine River and surrounding areas") and start of CBS News
- 2:05 Announcement ("The station you love to listen to at work, whether you work in an office, at home or in your car, KQKK, FM102") and song
- 2:09 Announcement by a woman ("Dial 102, KQKK-FM"), followed by a commentary by the show's host and a song
- 2:13 Announcement by a man ("Dial 102, KQKK-FM") followed by a song
- 2:17 Announcement by the woman as at 2:09, then announcement that Scott Curtis is the host, followed by ads for Amazon.com and Office Depot
- 2:18 Song ("You Got It")

I used a Collins UR388 receiver with two foot amplified loop antenna to receive KAKK. Your signal is quite strong here but is subject to some interference from KWOM in Watertown. Although I didn't hear any AM call letters announced, i understand that they were changed to KAKK several months ago; is this correct?

On the basis of the above details, I wish to request a brief letter confirming the fact that i indeed received your station's signals. I collect these letters as a hobby and have some 3000 at present. I would greatly appreciate a letter from KAKK to add to my collection. In fact, a statement, such as

"Mr. Sampson:

This will confirm your reception of KAKK on Way 24, 2001.

(signature)"

on KAKK's letterhead would be ideal. For your convenience in replying, I have enclosed a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

Many thanks in advance for your time, consideration and assistance. I hope that this report has been of interest to you and I will be looking forward to a confirmation.
