WEOL is pleased to acknowledge your report of reception of WEOL, Elyria, Ohio on June 23, 2001 at about 10:35 PM . As you listed, WEOL operates on a frequency of 930 KHz.

WEOL began broadcasting in 1948 with 1,000 watts of power and MOR format aimed at the 25 and up age group. Recently WEOL Changed to mainly broadcasting news and sports programming. Heavy emphasis is placed on local news and high school sports.

The WEOL main studios are located on the fourth floor of the Elyria Block Building (538 Broad Street) in downtown Elyria, Ohio

The WEOL transmitting site is located in a rural area approximately nine miles Southeast of Elyria and 2.8 miles east of Grafton. Our two directional antenna patterns radiate from four towers, two of which are 267 feet tall and two of which are 318 feet in height. The WEOL Main transmitter is a Harris SX-1A. Our Back up transmitter is an RCA model BTA-1R1. WEOL also has a 55KW Onan emergency standby power generator, assuring listeners of continuing service 24 hours daily
