Thank you for your reception report from Minnesota on July 24, 1998. Your report is confirmed.

WTAM 1100 operates 24 hours daily on 1100 kHz. We broadcast a format of news, sports and talk programs. In addition, WTAM 1100 is one of approximately 25 class 1-A clear-channel radio stations in the United States, broadcasting with a 50,000-watt non-directional signal. We are recognized as the station that is heard in 38 states and half of Canada.

WTAM has been on the air since 1923. Between 1972 and July 29, 1997, it was known by a series of different call signs, including WKYC, KYW and WWWE (3WE). We are owned by Jacor Communications, which is head-quartered in Covington, Kentucky.

WTAM 1100 is an affiliate of the ABC Radio Network. We are also the flagship station for the Cleveland Cavaliers and the Cleveland Indians.

Thank you again for writing. It is always exciting to receive reports from other states. We hope you will have the opportunity to tune in WTAM 1100 again in the future.
