It was very encouraging to receive your reception report of the 27th of February. In the past few months we have received reports from Texas, Indiana, and Conn. This is very surprising since we broadcast at only 50 watts.


In answer to your question concerning our call letters; in the past the station was identified as AHD, starting back in December 1947, presently we are identified as AFRS, the ARMED FORCES RADIO SERVICES.

We broadcast from a vertical radiator cut to $1/8$ the wave length using a Gates BC-250-GY transmitter modified for 50 watts. The station is equipped with Gates radio equipment and Ampex recorders.

Week day transmissions are from 6:00 A.M. to midnight and week-end from noon till 1:00 A.M., all times Atlantic Standard Time.

On behalf of the staff and myself I would like to extend thanks for your enlightening report.
