
Dear Mr. Sampson:

It gives us great pleasure to confirm your reception of CKUA on November 24, 1960 from 12:03 AM to 12:06 AM Mountain Standard Time.

Our night antenna pattern is quite favorable for reception in your direction when interference from other stations on the same frequency is not too strong. On night pattern, we protect KABI in Ketchikan, Alaska, KMJ in Fresno, California and CKY in Winnipeg, Manitoba, with a signal strength in each of these directions of 1,000 watts. However, the lobe between CKY and KMJ is by far the strongest of the two southern lobes, with a signal strength of .25 MV/M at approximately the Canadian-U.S., border.
