

This year HCJB is celebrating its thirtieth anniversary of broadcasting from the mountain city of Quito in the land of eternal spring--Ecuador. The majestic snow-capped peaks all around us have not changed at all during this period of time....but HCJB certainly has changed. In 1931 the Voice of the Andes had a small 250 watt transmitter and broadcast only a few hours daily on a local basis. Now HCJB has a combined transmitter power of over 100,000 watts and represents a 24-hour daily operation in eight languages.

We desire to take this opportunity of giving a personal testimony to the faithfulness and goodness of the God in whom we trust. Through the years we have seen God carry out His promises in miraculous ways. Many times the staff of HCJB has been driven to its knees in prayer to the Lord before some very pressing need.
