Dear Mr. Sampson:

This is to confirm your reception report of Sunday, January 21, 1962  
According to the information you have given us, you heard us from  
3:08 AM to 3:26 AM, using a Hammarlund HQ-129-X receiver  
and a 4½ Foot (diagonal) loop antenna system.

K E N N broadcasts on a frequency of 1390 kilocycles, with a power  
of 5000 watts daytime, 1000 watts nighttime. We use a standard Gates  
5 kw. transmitter, remotely controlled from the broadcasting studios.  
Two quarter-wave antennas are used during nighttime hours to produce  
a pattern from NNE to SSW.

KENN is affiliated with the A B C and Mutual networks, and normally  
broadcasts from 4:30 AM until 11:00 P M, although we are licensed to  
broadcast 24 hours per day. We program middle-of-the-road music, with  
the best of other types of music thrown in to provide a balance. We  
strive to keep a bright sound on the air.

Other Remarks:

Your programming list was correct as far as we know. At that time  
we were operating on a Remote schedule with commercials listed, but  
not logged, so we cannot confirm positively, ~~KENN~~ however, I was  
engineering at that time, and that sounds about right.

Your enclosing postage was a gesture that is unusual, and greatly  
appreciated.
