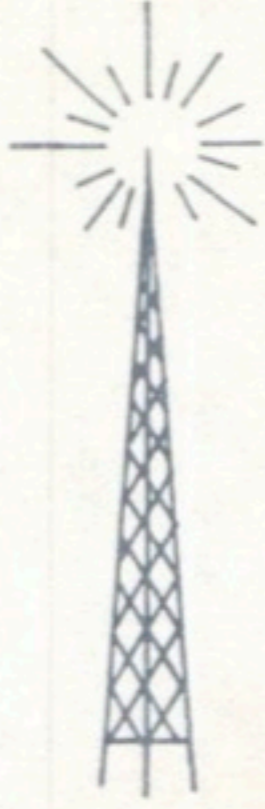

Dear Mr. Sampson,

I am sorry for the delay in answering your inquiry of May the 28th.

This is to confirm your reception report of May the 28th at 6:12 to 6:32 pm CST.

The station here is 1000 watts day and night. The transmitter is Western Electric 443*Al, with Andrew phasing and power dividing equipment. We are non-directional during the daytime hours, and four tower directional at night. The towers are 90 degrees high and spaced 90 degrees in line 25.5 degrees true north. The main night-time lobe is 25.5 degrees.

I trust that this information shall be of interest to you and satisfy your questions.
