This will acknowledge your very thorough report dated Monday, Jan. 22, 1962 concerning reception of WCAO.


We transmit with a power of 5000 watts on 600 k/c feeding a four element antenna system. We operate a 5 kw Westinghouse 5HV transmitter, have a 1 kw RCA standby with auxiliary power. Our transmitters are at 8001 Park Heights Ave, Pikesville 8, Maryland or about 11 miles northwest of downtown Baltimore. Executive offices and studios are at 1102 N Charles St in Baltimore.

WCAO also operates WCAO-fm on 102.7 mc/s with 20kw (effective radiated power) featuring International Good Music from 7 AM to 1 AM but I am sure you would ~~difficultly~~ ^{have} in receiving our fm transmissions.

Sorry!
WCAO is the oldest radio (broadcast) station in Maryland having started operation in 1922. Since we transmit on the same frequency as WICC (and WMT, WREC, WSJS, CFCF and CFCH) you are bound to get a lot of QRM in your area when you listen for us!

Thank you for your very kind report; this is the only way we know that we are really "getting out"!
