
Dear Mr. Sampson:

This is to confirm your reception of standard broadcast station KROC on May 20, 1991.

Our AM station is a 1 kilowatt non-directional, full time. (Class 4.) The tower is located just at the west edge of Rochester, with a height of 180 feet. Last October, I installed a "folded unipole" system. The tower is attached to the ground system, and the unipole, consisting of six strands of steel cable, acts as the radiator. It has dramatically increased our coverage, and I find that I do not have to drive the transmitter very hard to achieve a healthy signal. Our main transmitter is a Continental 314R-1. It is of the same design as the Collins "Baby Rock." As you may know, Continental purchased Collins' broadcast transmitter division several years ago.

I appreciate your DX confirmation. It helps me to know just where our signal is going. If you ever find yourself in the area, let me know ahead of time, and I'll gladly give you a tour of the facility.
