Dear Mr. Sampson:

This letter is confirmation of your reception of KWEB on Sunday, March 28, 1982. You did well to separate us from WWTC on an adjacent channel in your local area.

Enclosed is a copy of KWEB's primary daytime coverage. We operate with a power of 5000 watts days and 1000 watts nights, DA-2. Our directional anntenna system is a four tower in-line array located just south of Rochester. We use three towers by day and all four at night. Our coverage nulls the Twin Cities somewhat in order to protect the .5 mv/m of WWTC on adjacent 1280 khz. If you look at the map closely you will see their .5 mv/m contour drawn in the northwest corner. By the way, our main transmitter is a Harris MW-5A, and is less than 4 years old.
