
This letter is to confirm your reception of the our travelers information station on 530 KHZ on December 10, 1989. The transmitter is located at the weigh station on interstate highway 94 in Wisconsin just east of Hudson, Wisconsin. This is a licensed low-power radio station that, when put into use, will broadcast travel information to people entering Wisconsin from Minnesota. The broadcast range is supposed to be two and one-half miles although at that location it seems to be further due to the soil and the river near the station. The signal is not as strong in the Twin Cities due to other electrical interference, buildings, etc.

Thank you for letting us know of your reception of the signal. We hope you will enjoy learning of Wisconsin travel information in the future when the station is put into use. There are actually ten of these stations at various entrance points to Wisconsin at the border.
