Dear Mr. Sampson,

Thank you for your reception report of WCAM, Camden on April 7, 1973 from 5:33 AM to 5:51 AM, EST. After checking our program logs, I am happy to inform you that you did receive WCAM. You may consider this letter a verification of reception.

WCAM is owned and operated commerically by the City of Camden, N.J. We operate 24 hrs Monday thru Friday, 12 Midnight sign-off Saturday & Sunday.

Our transmitter is located at Pyne Point Park, Camden near the Delaware River and Petty's Island. Our power is 1000 watts daytime (650 watts ERP) and 250 watts nightime. Our power output is limited because several stations on our frequency. WTNJ, Trenton is on 1300 KHz and WJLK, Asbury Park is on 1310 KHz.

We are non-directional daytime and at night. Daytime signal reaches Delaware Memorial Bridge, Willingboro, N.J. and Upper Darby in Pa.

Thank you again for your report. Its interesting to note how far a signal travels at night.
