Dear John,

I am pleased to confirm your reception of WPUT 1510 khz on June 1, 1974 at New Providence, N.J. Your loggings of the Country Bath & Gift Shop coincide precisely with our logs. While we don't keep lists of music played, your description seems to fit our sound quite well.

WPUT is a daytime non-directional station, operating with 895 watts from sunrise to sunset. Due to our high frequency, short tower, and poor ground conductivity, our coverage extends only about 10 miles from our tower. Even within this area, we experience interference in the late afternoons from other stations on 1510, most notably WRAN and WMEX. Between 6am and sunrise, WPUT operates with 4.2 watts, which provides service only to the village of Brewster. Our Saturday and Sunday sign on is 7am.

We're glad you were able to pull us through WRAN down in New Jersey. Best of luck to you in your continued DX activities.
