
Dear John,

I am delighted to verify your report of reception of our station while we were conducting a frequency check the morning of December 17, 1954, from 1:50AM to 1:55 AM (CST) on 1580 kcs.

We are operating with a 250 Watt Gates transmitter, and utilizing a 150' universal cross sectional, guyed antenna. The checker in Kansas City informed us we completely blocked out XERF there and to his knowledge it was the first time it has been accomplished while he was on duty. It was our first check and was successful in every way and our main objective now is commercial broadcasting by January 1st.
