Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on December 23, 1956
from 1:00 A M to 1:02 A M Mountain Standard Time on 590 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

I heard the following announcement from KCST at 1:00 AM:

...Pueblo's present temperature at 1:00 is 26°, relative humidity 56%. And so ladies & gentlemen, KCST your radio station in Pueblo, Colorado, now leaves the air until 7:00 this morning.

Concluding 19 1/2 hours of continuous broadcast, KCST broadcasts on an assigned frequency of 590 Kc with a power of 1000 watts as authorized by the F.C.C. in Washington D.C. This is Martin Mendes speaking on behalf of our very good transmitter engineer (I couldn't hear the name due to static), & the entire staff & personnel of KCST, bidding you adieu very pleasant good morning."
