Dear Mr. Sampson:

In reply to your reception report no 71, I am pleased to hear that you were able to receive our station in Omaha, Neb. We run 5000 watts daytime and 1000 nitetime with directional antenna. At 4:32 our time we were still on daytime power. I have been in Omaha a number of times due to the fact that I am originally from southwest Iowa and my home town is only about 85 miles from Omaha. I worked as chief engineer at a 1000 watt daytime station in Creston, Iowa for two years before moving out here in August of last year. The equipment here is Gates and of course we have two towers for nitetime directional antenna. Your name seems familiar to me and possibly I have answered your letter at some earlier date while working at a station in Iowa.

The weather here gets rather low at nite but climbs into the 50's usually during the daytime. The temperature at christmas day was in the 50 degree mark. It is a lot different than Iowa and Neb weather of which I have been used to for so many years.

I have a friend who works at WOW tv in Omaha by the name of Bob Faulk. I wonder if sometime you might call him and tell him hello for me.
