This letter is to verify your reception of KLAK on January 6, 1955, from 2:01-2:10 AM, CST as we were conducting equipment tests. We want to apologize for not answering your letter sooner but it has been quite a job getting KLAK on the air and operating smoothly so we are just now getting around to answering reports. KLAK started its regular broadcast schedule on January 8th two days after you heard our equipment tests. You might be interested in knowing that we also received reports from Everett Johnson of Mendota, Ill. and Len Kruse of Dubuque, Iowa for this same ET.

For your information KLAK operates on a frequency of 1580 Kc's with a power of 250 watts days. Our studios are located in "This Ole House" at 1315 Oak Street, Lakewood, Colorado. We feature "hillbilly" music exclusively on our regular broadcast schedule. Our equipment is Gates throughout and our tower is 180 feet high. You also might be interested in knowing that we have reports from all over the U.S. as well as 10 reports from New Zealand so you can see our 250 watts get out very well.

Lakewood is a suburb of Denver located about 5 miles directly West of Denver only a short 15 minute drive from the beautiful Rocky Mountains of Colorado. If you are ever out this way be sure and stop in to visit our studios and chat with us. You will find the people of Colorado very friendly. Lakewood has an estimated population of 30000 and is still growing steadily.

In closing we want to thank you for your report which was correct all the way and lots of luck to you in your future DXing.
