Dear N.R.C. Member:

This letter is to verify that you heard a broadcast by this station on February 20, 1955 from 2:00 a.m. to 2:30 a.m. Mountain Standard Time.

Station details: 1000 watts, 1390 KC, hours: 6:00 a.m. year around to local sundown. On the air for the first time October, 1955. Primary coverage area fifty mile radius. Antenna 165 feet high built by owner, Professor Haycock. Manager is Mel Richardson. RCA Transmitter model ML-7100A. Collins console model 12-H. Location: Logan, Utah, population less than 17,000.

I am happy to report that I received over seventy reports from dx listeners which makes it impossible to answer each one individually. Every one had enough information to verify that they heard this station.

I am regretful that there were two interfering stations on the air at the time of my broadcast. One was unknown (Spanish speaking) and the other was WDEB Gulfport, Miss. Incidentally, we were heard as far as Southern California, Eastern New York and North to Ontario, Canada.

I wish to thank you for your report. We are very happy to find that our signals can be heard for such great distances.
