Thank you for yours of recent date, giving us a verification of your reception of our frequency check program, with the Van-
Nostrand Radio Engineering Service, at Atlanta, Ga.

Our hours of operation are from 6:30am to 11:00pm daily. Incidentally KLUF is now in our 33rd year of broadcasting. Our original call letters were KFLX, but in 1933 we were granted new call letters of KLUF, which when pronounced as spelled, is exactly like our name, Clough; we had the letters changed for that reason, as a sort of trade mark.

I suppose you would like to be in Galveston, as from your letter it gets pretty cold where you are! I have been here ever since 1902 and held a ham license for many years, up to the time when broadcasting became too complicated for me to spare time for chats with others. My eldest son, Lee Clough, holds a ham license, but has not been able to make much use of it lately.

We received two requests for verification, one from you, and one from Denver, Colorado. Denver and Omaha being so far apart, we feel that is proof of good reception, even tho some fading, etc., may have taken place! The man's name from Denver, is Francis H.
