This is in reply to your report of reception of KNEB the morning of August 3, 1958.

The report agrees with our schedule. We were on the air for frequency check with a 1000 cycle tone at the time.

It is unfortunate that you were unable to hear our identification as this would provide proof-positive that you were receiving us, however, I think it was unlikely that you were listening to another station. We have had other reports from Omaha, too, so we know it is possible for us to be heard there under ideal conditions.

Our night pattern protects KMA in Shennandoah, Iowa. This results in an extremely weak signal in your direction. The difficulty you had in hearing us seems to bear this out, doesn't it?
