I am pleased to report reception of your station on January 30, 1958
from 5:35 P M to 5:44 P M Central Standard Time on 1260 kcs.
Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

- 5:35 A show, presented by KTAE, in ~~corps~~ co-operation with the Taylor ~~State~~ Chamber of Commerce was just ending
 - 5:35 Station ID and announcement of the correct C. S. T. Then came the start of the Summary of the Latest News from the wires of the UP and the KTAE news room. Presented by a Plymouth Distributor in Taylor, and I think the name of the dealer was 'Simmonds'
- The signal then faded out until ~~5:44~~ 5:44, when the sign off announcement was in progress. I got a snatch of it, as follows@
 " . . . in Downtown Taylor Texas. Our transmitter is located 1/2 mile . . . until tomorrow morning at 5:30 A. M. . . . this is Fred . . . saying good evening . . . and now ~~we~~ our national Anthem"
 The station then left the air with the National ~~Atm~~ Anthem.

*Thanks for your report.
 Our log verifies your reception.
 The operator on duty at that time was Fred Switzer and you heard a Simmonds Motor Co. commercial.*
