Dear Mr. Sampson:

This will confirm your reception of KXLR on January 3, 1957, from 5:27 A.M. to 5:30 A.M. C. S. T.

KXLR operates on 1150 KC with a daytime power of 5 KW and night time power of 1 ^{kw}W directional, using four 217 feet towers. We use a Gates BC 5 B Transmitter, with one Emiac 3X2500F3 in the power amplifier, modulated by two 3X2500F3. This is one of the first transmitters using the smaller tubes with 5000 Volts on the Plate and 1.25 Amps for 5 KW output for commercial broadcasting.

We are on the air from 5:30 A.M. to 11:00 P.M. C.S.T. with our regular program schedule.
