Dear Mr. Sampson:

Thank you for your letter of September 1, 1954, describing reception of Radio Station WIGM from 2:30 to 3:00 AM CST, on September 1st. Your log of my program is sufficiently accurate, therefore, this letter serves as varification of your report.

This station is on the air, the first Wednesday morning of each month, which is a regular "frequency check." The same march selection "Stars and Stripes Forever" is usually repeated throughout the program for exact identification for our checking point, with the Phelps Labs of Minneapolis.

Equipment at this station is mostly RCA equipment, except our limiting amp and a few mikes which are WE. Our studio and transmitter are located in the same building, and our station is just outside the city limits of Medford.

We've been on the air since October 1941, and have been affiliated with Mutual since the spring of 1948.

On behalf of our management and staff of WIGM, we wish to thank you for your report and extend your future success in your DXing.
