Thank you very much for your reception report of WJLD on January 10, 1955 from 1:41am to 1:55am CST. Your report corresponds with our log 100%. Please except this letter as a VERIFICATION of WJLD.

I understand that you just recently joined the NRC. Welcome to the club. You'll find that it's a fine organization, with alot of fine members. I think that the National Radio Club will more than live up to it's reputation as being the best radio club in the world. The Newark News Radio Club is running a close second.

So far, we have received 40 reports from the United States, including 5 from New Zealand.

You wanted to know some info about WJLD. Well, the transmitter is a Collins and the studios are RCA equiped. The tower is 300ft high, shunt fed. The pattern is non-directional. WJLD'S regular transmission hours are from 6:00am to 12:00 midnight CST, 7 days a week. Programs from 6:00pm are solid music.
