Radio Station KGGF:

On Tuesday, May 8, 2001, from 11:55 PM to 12:00 Midnight (Central Daylight Time), it was my pleasure to monitor a portion of the transmissions of KGGF on 690 kHz from my location, which is about 20 miles northwest of Phoenix. As proof of this reception, I offer the following listing of items I heard:


- 11:55 When I tuned in, the Jim Bohannon Show was in progress
- 11:58 Announcement, end of the show, and start of a "Thought for the Day" type of message; I think that the name of the person giving the message was Father White or something similar
- 11:59 End of the message, an announcement ("KGGF, Coffeeville, Kansas") and a sign off announcement followed; I was able to copy the last part of it, which was "... Coffeeville, Kansas. We invite you to join us tomorrow for another day of broadcasting. On behalf of General Manager John Leonard and the staff here at AM690, KGGF, goodnight."
- 12:00 You left the air

I used a Drake R8B receiver with two foot amplified loop antenna to receive KGGF. Your signal was quite weak under several other stations. The strongest here is XETRA in Tijuana, Mexico, but by using the loop antenna, I was able to null them and hear you. You were also subject to quite a bit of fading.

On the basis of the above details, I wish to request a brief letter confirming the fact that I indeed received your station's signals. I collect these letters as a hobby and have some 3000 at present. I would greatly appreciate a letter from KGGF to add to my collection. In fact, a statement, such as

"Mr. Sampson:


This will confirm your reception of KGGF on May 8, 2001.
