KLTW (AM) 1420 KHZ SIERRA VISTA, AZ__X__

KZMK (FM) 100.7 MHZ SIERRA VISTA, AZ _____

KWCD (FM) 92.3 MHZ BISBEE, AZ _____

Your report is an accurate reflection of the programming being carried on our station at that time and that day.

KLTW (AM) 1420 is a 1500 watt daytime, 500 watt nighttime regionally licensed station running a contemporary Christian format. Formerly the station has held the callsigns KTAN and KHFH.

KZMK (FM) on 100.7 is an adult contemporary radio station running 3000 watts. it has formerly held callsigns KWCD, KTAZ-FM and KHFH-FM

KWCD (FM) on 92.3 is a Country Western radio station running 55 watts ERP from the top of the Mule Mts. (equivalent to 3000 watts) near Bisbee, Az, 19 miles S.E. of our studios in Sierra Vista. KWCD has also held the callsign KZMK and was formerly on the frequency of 92.1 Mhz

Both KLTW and KZMK operate from antenna's located in the middle of Sierra Vista, Az, Home of Ft. Huachuca, near the Mexican border and the famous OK Coral in Tombstone. KLTW is a two tower directional pattern with a primary lobe towards Tucson to the N.W.
