Dear Mr. Sampson:

This will confirm your reception of KOJ 778 on November 3, 1998.

It is not the intent of the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area to broadcast local Traveler's Information Station transmissions beyond the licensed area of 2.5 miles. However, atmospheric conditions may sometimes enable receivers to hear broadcasts well beyond the normal area.

Consider yourself fortunate that you were able to hear us and may that never happen again, but only if you come to visit wonderful Glen Canyon and the beautiful city of Page, Arizona.

KOJ 778 is mounted on top of the National Park Service Headquarters building located along Hwy 89 1 mile south of the Glen Canyon Dam. The antenna is a 10-foot fractional wave using the building as a ground plane. The transmitter is configured at 10 watts of continuous power with station identifier every time the audio program is played. The audio program as present is general information of the area and boater safety, which takes about 180 seconds and is repeated.
