Mr. Sampson:

This is to confirm your report of reception of KOFO-1220 on 9 February 1970 from 2:21 to 2:35 AM, EST. Yours is the first report from east of Kansas to mention interference from XEB. All reports so far have bemoaned the fact that CHSC was on with country music all Monday morning. Until the reports began arriving after our special IRCA test of 2 February, I was not aware CHSC was going AN Mondays.

NRCer Bruce Reynolds (an old college buddy of mine) sent a tape from Texas which contained KOFO at times on top of XEB, so I feel pretty good.

KOFO has moved about 150 meters east of its old location since you heard it in Omaha, I suspect. The station erected a half-wave tower and moved over, lock, stock, and studios between sign off and sign on one January day in 1964. The taller tower is primarily needed to support our FM antenna.

Reports from the two tests have come from all extremes of the United States, with the expeption of Hawaii, and I was rather hoping we could make it across the Pacific. To date, I have heard nothing from Richard Wood although he requested I keep the station on later than 0300 EST so some Pacific area listeners could hear the station.
