I am pleased to report reception of your station on Monday, March 17, 1969
from 3:15 AM to 3:29 AM Eastern Standard Time on 1480 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

- 3:15 The "National Anthem" was played
- 3:16 A sign on announcement was given - that WBTS was signing on for a frequency check
- 3:17 An instrumental selection (by Al Hirt, I believe) was played
- 3:19 A station ID was given & another instrumental selection was played (Al Hirt, I think)
- 3:22 Station ID & instrumental selection (Al Hirt, again)
- 3:24 Station ID & instrumental selection (---)
- 3:26 Station ID ("This is a frequency check broadcast, coming to you from WBTS, Bridgeport, Alabama" - repeated twice) & song (Al Hirt, again)
- 3:29 I think you left the air around here, but I tuned out briefly, & when I came back to 1480, you were gone
