Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on Friday, July 27, 1970,
from 8:55 PM to 8:57 1/2 PM Eastern Daylight Time on 990 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

8:55 you faded in right at the end of an announcement - concerning "Ending another "Sunset . . . Programs for a Friday Evening" - then the names of the sponsors of the program were given - including Markham Ford Sales; Haslemis - Cana (I think) at 352 2nd Avenue downtown; & the "Shake Shop"

8:56 1/2 you were starting to fade out by this time, & your signal was very weak, but I did hear an announcement to get requests in the mail to WJEH - PO Box 448 in Gallipolis - then, I think a reminder was given to have a good weekend & to drive safely. After this, you faded completely, & I was unable to hear you any longer. I listened until after 9 PM (when I guess you signed off) but couldn't hear any more from you

Receiver: Hammarlund HQ-180A Signal strength: Quite good when you faded in & during the announcement
Antenna: 4 1/2 foot loop
Interference: Extremely heavy from WNOX - they generally dom - ment
Atmospheric noise: Some from a local thunder storm Fading: indicated in late 990 Readability: Good, during the announcement
Temperature 76 degrees. Weather: cloudy at night here, & it is very unusual to hear someone else.
