Monitoring Report for Radio Station WLES on 580 kHz.

Date ^{Thurs day} July 6, 1972 Monitoring period 6:00 AM to 6:04 AM Eastern Daylight Time

It was my pleasure to monitor transmissions from your station during the above period. As proof of reception I offer this log of items heard:

6:00 The National Anthem was broadcast, followed by your sign on announcement. I tape recorded it & was able to copy the following:

Good morning from the staff & management of radio station WLES in Lawrenceville, Virginia, as authorized by the F.C.C. in Washington, D.C. WLES operates on 580 kilohertz with an effective radiated power of 500 watts serving southern Virginia & northern North Carolina. WLES studios are located in the Law Building, 4th St in downtown Lawrenceville, Virginia, our transmitter ... (x you faded briefly & I was unable to hear any more from your announcement)

Technical Information

Receiving equipment: Hammarlund HQ-180 A with 4 1/2 foot loop antenna (used to peak you)

Interfering stations: Some from WCIS & WAGR - you eventually faded & were under both of these.

Reception conditions: Good - no static
Other stations confirmed in your area: WJWS, WEVA
Since WCIS & WAGR dominate 580. During the day, I must just be outside your coverage area

6:00 1/2 News headlines were given - first National then state
6:02 1/2 Baseball Results
6:03 Weather conditions were given
6:04 Announcement of the time & the program "Navy Hoedown" started. You faded again about this time & I was unable to hear any more definitely attributable to WLES.
