Mr. Sampson:

Thank you for your letter requesting a reception report of WTSB radio on June 6, 1972.

WTSB Radio operates on 1340 Khz on AM, and 95.7 Mhz on FM. Our AM side operates at a power of 1000 Watts in the day, and 250 Watts at night. WTSB's FM operates a thousand watts out of the transmitter with an effective radiated rated power of 6500 watts.

The format at WTSB is Top 40 MOR during the day and Top 40 Rock at night until eleven o'clock. At that time we switch to a program we call "DREAMTIME", which is a program of very soft music. We sign off at 12:40 in the morning.

Checking back through our logs, we find that you were, in fact listening to our broadcast, therefore we are happy to verify your reception of WTSB Radio on June 21, 1972 from 7:27PM, to 7:33PM.
