Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on Sunday, June 7, 1970,
from 6:00 AM to 6:02 AM Eastern Daylight Time on 1250 kcs.

Programs and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

6:00 The National Anthem was played

6:01 The following sign or announcement (which I tape recorded & copied as well as possible) was given. The ... indicate parts I couldn't hear due to fading or interference from WDVA.

"Good morning. This is radio station WYTH, Madison, Georgia, beginning another day of broadcasting activity ... operating on an assigned frequency of 1250 kilocycles with 1000 watts of power from 6 AM until local sunset as authorized by the F.C.C., Washington, D.C. This is Annie Lee Small inviting you to stay tuned throughout the day for the music, news, weather, & fine entertainment ... and now its time for our first report of late news."

6:02 A news bumper started & the newscast (read by the same announcer) started. You faded almost immediately.

Receiver: Hammarlund HQ-100-A Signal strength: Very good during
Antenna: 4 1/2 foot loop
Interference: Extremely heavy from semi-local WDVA
Atmospheric noise: None Fading: As noted
Temperature: 55 degrees. Weather: clear

The National Anthem & the first 1/3 of your sign on announcement. After the first fade, tho, you became progressively weaker & were gone by the start of the news.

I shall be pleased to hear from you in reply to the above report, and to receive a letter of verification of my reception, for which RETURN POSTAGE is enclosed. Sincerely,
