I am pleased to report reception of your station on Sunday, June 7, 1970,
from 6:00 AM to 6:02 AM Eastern Day Light Time on 1250 kcs.

Poems and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

6:00 The National Anthem was played

6:01 The following sign on announcement (which I tape recorded & copied as well as possible) was given. The "..." indicate parts I couldn't hear due to fading or interference from WDVA.

"Good morning. This is radio station WYTH, Madison Georgia, beginning another day of broadcasting activity . . . operating on an assigned frequency of 1250 kilocycles with 1000 watts of power from 6 AM until local sunset as authorized by the F.C.C., Washington, D.C. This is Annie Lee Small inviting you to stay tuned throughout the day for the music, news, weather, & fine entertainment . . . and now it's time for our first report of late news."

6:02 A news beeper sparked & the newscast (~~was~~ read by the same announcer) started. You faded almost immediately
