Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on Thursday, October 18, 1962
from 12:27 A M to 12:39 A M Mountain Standard Time on 1240 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

- 12:27 MST 1000 cycle tone.
- 12:27:50 Station ID: "KSLV in Monte Vista, Colorado, broadcasting on the assigned frequency of 1240 kcs."
- 12:28 1000 cycle tone.
- 12:30:30 Station ID: (same as above)
- 12:30:40 1000 cycle tone.
- 12:33:45 Station ID: "This is KSLV, Monte Vista, Colorado, broadcasting on the assigned frequency of 1240 kcs.; on the air for a Frequency Test Transmission."
- 12:33:55 1000 cycle tone. 1240
- 12:37:50 Station ID: "This is KSLV, ~~1240~~ KCS on your radio dial in Monte Vista, Colorado, on the air with Frequency Test Transmission. KSLV Monte Vista, Colorado."
- 12:38 1000 cycle tone.

This is my second report to your station. The first was mailed to your Chief Engineer on the above date, and as of February 22, 1963, I have not received a letter from KSLV. This past Thursday, during the same time, I heard KSLV on the air with a similar Frequency Check. This time, you were not heard as clear as in October.

May I please have a verification of reception, typed on your KSLV Letter-head, stating the date & time of this report. Where are your studios and transmitter located in Monte Vista? Were you making the Frequency Check with Denver or Lee's Summit, Missouri? I believe that my first report was either lost or misplaced.

I thank you very much for your interest in our hobby of DXing, and the best in Radio is wished to you and KSLV. 73's.
