This will confirm your reception reports of the KUAD signal on September 24, 1971, and May 7, 1972. We find your description of our program corresponds with our logs for those dates.

I'm sorry you had to go to the trouble of a phone call in order to obtain verification. But, as I'm sure you've experienced, small stations are many times the most difficult from which to get a response. Not always, but I'm afraid we're one of them.


I'm surprised to note that you received our station at our sign-off. Usually we receive reports from DXers who have listened in the early morning hours. Your friend, Carl Dabelstein, is one of those early risers.

KUAD is 1000 watts daytime with 500 watts pre-sunrise authority. Our single 350' tower provides us with a wide non-directional pattern, extending well beyond the local computed contours shown on the enclosed coverage map. The map represents our primary sales area.

As our Chief Engineer doesn't answer reception reports, I try to get to them when I can. Frank urged me to expedite a reply, but unfortunately was unable to provide me with the typing skills to handle the assignment.
