This will be confirmation of your reception of WELI, New Haven, Conn. on Monday April 10, 1967 from 102 Am to 110 AM EST.

Our normal sign off time is 100 AM but on the second Monday of each month we stay on for about 10 minutes extra for frequency measurement purposes. Probably at that time most of the eastern stations on 960 KC are off the air and it is a good time for DXers to pick us up.

Several months ago our sign on time was made 15 minutes earlier at 515 Am instead of 530 AM and we have received several reports from DXers who have picked us up between 515 AM & 520 AM. Apparently a lot of the 960 KC stations sign on at 530 AM and the sign on engineer arrives for work and gets his carrier on about 520 AM. One listener in Gary, Indiana told how he was receiving us fine and suddenly we were gone instantly. Of course what happened was WSBT next door in South Bend Indiana turned on their carrier and as they probably start programming at 530 AM the listener did not realize what had happened.

I am enclosing also our regular confirmation card and several sales promotion sheets one of which has a coverage map which you requested. There is also a bookmark card put out by Connecticut Broadcasters Association which lists all of the Connecticut stations.
