Dear Mr. Wesolowski:


This will confirm your reception of WCNU on 1010 KHz, on Thursday morning, February 13. At the time specified in your letter, WCNU was conducting a frequency measurement, using a telephone dial tone. You asked for verification of the date and time, 1:31 a.m. to 1:40 a.m. We were operating at that time...actually being on the air from approximately 1:29 a.m. until 1:44 a.m. At the time you lost the signal (1:40 a.m.), the main transmitter was taken off the air and the auxiliary transmitter (with the same power) was placed on the air.

The call letters WCNU do not stand for anything in particular. They were selected at random when the station was in the planning stage in 1947.

I am enclosing a calendar-pencil holder and a "Halffoot" ruler as mementoes...I hope that both will be of some benefit to you.

Thanks for your letter, and tell other club members to try us. We like to hear from distant points where we have been received. Frequency measurements are conducted on the second Thursday of each month, from 1:30-1:45, Central Time.
