Your report of the interference by XERF was confirmed by other DX'ers. At the time of the Frequency Check I did not know of this interference. I am glad you brought it to my attention.

For your information our antenna is: 185' (190' overall height) uniform cross-section, guyed, series-excited vertical steel radiator. Main studio is located at 327 South 8th St. We have a Type 20-V, Broadcasting Transmitter. We are a non-directional daytime station.
